ABOUT



An American nonprofit with a program in Italy, the Bogliasco Foundation awards one-month Fellowships to individuals of all ages and nationalities who have made significant contributions in the arts and humanities.

Fellows live and work in bucolic surroundings on the coast near Genoa, where natural beauty combines with an intimate group setting to encourage inquiry and transformative exchange across disciplines.

Since its founding in 1996, the Foundation has welcomed approximately 1200 Fellows from 63 countries.





MISSION

The Bogliasco Foundation supports the arts and humanities by providing the time and space for artists and scholars to work in complete freedom.

The Foundation strives to cultivate deep connections between Fellows in a diversity of disciplines and at different stages of their careers.

In partnership with local cultural institutions, the Foundation organizes public events in New York City and Genoa to share the work our Fellows have developed in residence.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Foundation welcomes applications from individuals doing creative or scholarly work in the arts and humanities.* Rotating international selection committees of distinguished peers evaluate applicants based on significant achievement in their fields and the quality of their projects. Residency groups of 8-10 Fellows include one representative from each discipline, and a diversity of age, gender and nationality. The Foundation awards approximately 60 Fellowships each year in seven residency periods that run from September through May.

DAILY LIFE



During their residencies, Fellows are provided with private accommodation, meals, and a work space. Travel expenses are not covered. The Bogliasco Foundation is one of the few residency programs to include spouses/partners, who enhance the strong sense of community at the Center.





The Foundation recognizes the importance of connecting Fellows to the surrounding region of Liguria, which has stimulated creative expression for centuries. Many Fellows also forge ties with peers at cultural institutions in the great port city of Genoa.

The unique composition of our groups results in a vibrant intellectual and creative exchange. Since each Fellow represents a different field, conversations expand beyond traditional boundaries, individual projects evolve, and unexpected collaborations arise. Fellows report that this cross-disciplinary environment influences their work for years to come.

THE GARDEN



The Villa dei Pini garden is considered to be a masterpiece of early twentieth century landscape design. A precipitously steep and stone-terraced hillside is traversed by a series of intricate winding paths, many of them edged with *faux bois* fencing. Agaves, aloes, and other semi-tropical succulents are interplanted with Mediterranean flora, while umbrella pine trees, seemingly defying gravity, frame breathtaking views of the Ligurian coastline.





Each Fellow is provided with a well-equipped, spacious studio or work space. The Visual Arts, Music and Dance studios include special amenities. With Wifi access available throughout the Center, Fellows are also welcome to work in any of the communal spaces.

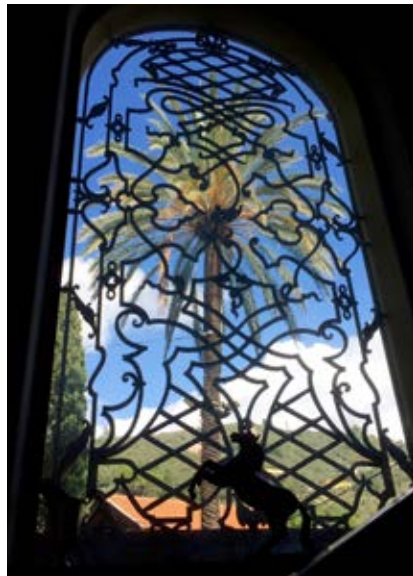

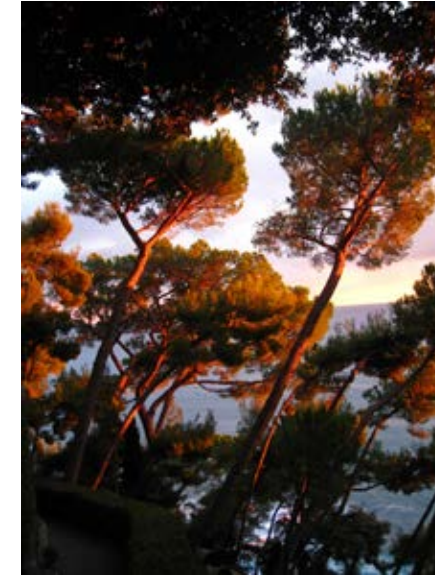
